

# Citation & Bibliography Resources

Learning how to properly cite sources for a paper or project can be very confusing and time-consuming. Fortunately there is lots of help to be had at UM and online. Here are some great resources to rely on for help.

*How do I use RefWorks?*

1. **Set up an account.** Access RefWorks directly through UM Library at <http://www.lib.umich.edu/eresources> and "sign up for individual account."
2. **Collect Useful Articles.** As you search in Mirlyn or many databases, you can "export" lists of articles or books directly into Refworks. You can also save lists as text files and "import" into RefWorks.
3. **Create a Bibliography.** In the "Bibliography" section of RefWorks, you can automatically format your list into APA, MLA, Chicago, or any format you want and download as a MS Word document.
